Other western states \$22. Snap beans—Washington and Oregon \$110; and all other western states, \$80. Sweet corn, Washington and Oregon \$23, and other western states \$17. Green peas—an increase of \$17.50 per ton over the average 1942 reported price for all states by grades and sizes. To assure themselves of these minimum prices, growers must contract with certified canners, that is, canners who have agreed to participate in the program.
