Post-War Military Training Asked in Bills

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12.—(AP)—Congress today had for study legislation which would provide compulsory military training for all youths of the nation after the war.
Rep. Wadsworth (R., N. Y.) and Senator Gurney (R., S. D.) introduced almost identical measures yesterday to provide that when a youth becomes 18, or within three years thereafter, he shall be inducted into the army or navy for a training period of one year. Upon completing of training, he would for four years be in a reserve status and subject to call for any prescribed refresher course.
The Wadsworth-Gurney proposals would become effective six months after the present war ends and would utilize present training camps.
