SALEM, Ore., March 4 .- (AP) The Marion county grand jury, investigating the deaths last No vember of 47 state hospital patients because of roach powder poisoning, recommended today that the hospital hire more employes so it would not have to depend so much on inmate help.

A patient, looking for powdered milk, got into a barrel of roach powder, which was mixed with crambled eggs and fed to the patients.

The jury held that no indivi-dual can be held criminally re-

The jury commended Dr. J. C.

Evans, hospital superintendent, for their "efficient work" in saving the lives of 400 other patients who had eaten the poison.
