

## Laborites Oppose Vocational Course At Oregon Prison

SALEM, Ore., May 5.—(AP)—Plans of the state board of control to establish a vocational training program at the state penitentiary struck a snag today when representatives of organized labor objected to it.

The board requested O. I. Paulson, state director of vocational education, who would run the prison program, to confer with the labor leaders.

The program, to be financed by the government, would include production of war materials as well as a long-range program to fit the prisoners for work after

their release from prison.

The board said several labor leaders objected on grounds that prison-made goods would be competing after the war with other products on the open market, and thus deprive some laborers of work.

The program calls for immediate establishment of a machine shop class of 12 to 14 prisoners. Other classes to be added would include garment making, drafting, meat handling, cooking and baking, sheet metal work and farm production.

Board members said they felt confident the labor leaders would approve the program when it is explained to them.

## New Cash Farm Account Books Available Here

A supply of the new Oregon cash farm record books, prepared by the farm management department at the Oregon State college and issued by the O. S. C. Extension service, has been received by County Agent J. Roland Parker, and copies may now be had at the usual nominal price to cover cost of printing.

This new account book has been designed especially to help farmers keep simple records that will aid them in making out their income tax returns on a cash basis. Those who wish to file reports on the accrual basis or who prefer

to keep inventory records will continue to use the standard Oregon farm account book, which is also available at the county agent's office, explains Mr. Parker.

The new book contains 24 pages of blanks for listing farm receipts and operating expenditures by months. Space is also provided for a monthly summary of farm receipts and expenditures and a depreciation record for farm improvements, machinery, equipment and of breeding and work stock. Several other miscellaneous blanks are included for recording items needed in making income tax returns and in keeping a record of farm operations.

As an extra convenience, though not connected with cash account records, there is a page for keeping a crop record and another page which contains frequently used information such as

rules for measuring, various weights and measures, and a gestation table.

Now that federal income tax returns are required of every family, on a farm or elsewhere, that has \$1200 or more of annual gross income, it will pay every farm family in dollars and cents to keep at least the kind of records provided for in this new account book, says Mr. Parker. Experience has shown that those who keep regular record will save on their income taxes, as it is easier to forget expenditures than it is receipts.

## Independent Stores in Oregon Show Sales Gain

WASHINGTON, May 5.—(AP)—Sales of 508 independent retail stores, exclusive of department stores, in Oregon, increased 38 per cent during March, 1943, compared with the sales of the same month last year, the Department

of Commerce disclosed today. The sales gained 19 per cent over February.

Drygoods and general merchandise stores led with an advance of 72 per cent. Other gains: shoe stores 84 per cent, restaurants, cafeterias, lunchrooms 59 per cent, food stores 46 per cent, drug stores 44 per cent, women's ready-to-wear stores 41 per cent, general stores 35 per cent, men's clothing stores 24 per cent.

Dollar volume of filling stations dropped 6 per cent.

Of the durable goods trade, outstanding sales increases were registered for lumber-building materials dealers, 77 per cent, jewelry stores 62, hardware 24, motor-vehicle dealers 23.

## Oregon Tops U. S. in War Production Training

PORTLAND, May 5.—(AP)—Oregon leads the nation in the war production training program with slightly more than 10 per cent of the state's population enrolled in classes.

So reported Director O. I. Paulson to the Oregon advisory committee here. He said total enrollment is 113,000. Washington is second among states with 8 per cent of the population enrolled.

The committee announced new training programs in mining, transportation and lumbering, including courses for fallers and buckers. Job instructor classes have been expanded and now include Roseburg, Medford, Klamath Falls, Grants Pass, Pendleton and The Dalles.
