Mileage Cut Ordered for Eastern Buses, Taxicabs

WASHINGTON, May 27—(AP)—Implementing its order for an over all reduction of 40 per cent in gasoline rations for all commercial vehicles in the eastern shortage area, the ODT today directed bus and taxicab operators to reduce their mileage immediately by 20 per cent.

Verdict Favors Appellant in Road Appraisal Trial

Circuit court today took up the case of the Douglas Creditors association versus E. G. High after a jury late Wednesday returned a verdict in favor of R. H. Wilson in his appeal from the county court action on the petition of John F. Hensley for a gateway road.

The jury in the Hensley-Wilson case, the first to be heard in the May term, made no finding with regard to the damages for the proposed gateway road petitioned for by Hensley through the Wilson place, but simply held that the road viewers had failed to locate the road on the site which would cause the least damage to the Wilson property. The decision nullifies all previous proceedings and will require an entirely new start on the road Hensley claims is needed to provide a suitable outlet from his property.

The action heard today is one in which the creditors association is bringing suit on a claim assigned by the widow of a doctor

at Yreka, Calif. It is claimed that the defendant High failed to pay a bill of \$1313. The doctor is since deceased and the claim was assigned by his widow. High contends that full settlement was made prior to the death of the physician.

Speaker Here to Recount Ordeal as Gestapo Prisoner

Ivan Jacobson, 24-year old employee of the American legation in Oslo, Norway, will speak at the Roseburg Junior high school at 8 o'clock tonight and will recount his experiences as a prisoner of the German gestapo.

Jacobson, a native of Tacoma, Wash., who helped Americans leave Norway after the German invasion, was arrested at the Swe-

dish border in December, 1940, while on his way to a post in Moscow. Starved on a diet of black bread, salt fish and potatoes, he lost 26 pounds during four months in prison. His body still bears scars of beatings. After four months he escaped from a hospital after "faking" an attack of appendicitis. He returned voluntarily when he found that Norwegian friends had been seized for punishment because of his escape. He made a second escape attempt three weeks later by deliberately breaking his arm in order to return to the hospital, but before escape plans were completed he was exchanged for a German prisoner held in the U. S. He is now in the employ of the

Royal Norwegian information service, but has been loaned to the Oregon State Defense council for a series of talks in the interest of the civilian defense organization. He will explain civilian defense organization in Norway. All residents of Roseburg and vicinity are urged by the Douglas county defense council to attend tonight's meeting.
