Allied Fleet Raids Axis Convoy Off Toe of Italy

ed to steam into battle at an
hour's notice."

Dispatches from allied head
quarters said American war
planes swept over "Mussolini's
rock" at Pantelleria island almost
at will yesterday, smashing
buildings in the port area, and
shot up bivouacked troops and ra-
dio installations in southern Sar-
dinia.

Pantelleria lies 45 miles east
of Cap Bon, Tunisia, and is strat-
egically important as a poten-
tial stepping-stone for an invasion
of Sicily or the Italian mainland.

Axis Displays Jitters
Both Rome and Berlin plucked
nervously at the specter of an
allied invasion of Europe, with
axis broadcasts ranging from na-
zi defiance to fascist appeals for
courage.

"Our fate will be terrible
should we lose this war," said a
Rome military spokesman, appar-
ently seeking to frighten the It-
alians into a last-ditch stand.

"Nobody will be spared."
Another Italian commentator
declared that "not much quarter"
would be given British and Amer-
ican invasion forces, and add-
ed:

"It would be a matter of but-
cher and be butchered."

A Berlin broadcast, discussing
two invasion articles in the Ger-
man organ "Die Wehrmacht,"
stressed the possibility of allied
thrusts into Europe from several
directions, and declared:

"An Anglo-American expedi-
tionary force might perhaps suc-
ceed in crossing the Mediterran-
ean and landing somewhere in
southern Europe, but it would not
have the slightest chance in bat-
tle against axis continental ar-
mies with their millions of well-
trained and well-equipped
troops."

Coupled with this boast of axis
inevitability, the broadcast con-
ceded that allies "might perhaps
succeed in obtaining a foothold at
some points on the Norwegian
coast for some time."

"It cannot be denied, of course,
that the Anglo-American occupa-
tion of Tunisia created a new sit-
uation in the Mediterranean," the
broadcast added. "It would be
foolish to ignore the fact that the
Anglo-Americans now are in a
position to use the bases in Tun-
isia for offensive operations
against Europe."

Berlin previously had named
June 22 as "Der Tag" for the
allies' grand assault on Europe.
