Stockings Will Escape Rationing

WASHINGTON, June 3—(AP)—Eighty-five per cent of the hosiery worn by women this year will be of rayon, the Office of War Information reported in announcing there are no plans for rationing stockings.

The selection will be less varied than in peacetime and the emphasis will be on wearing quality rather than sheerness. Prices are restrained by dollars and cents ceilings which specify definite quality grades for each price.

Other points developed in the OWI report on hosiery: Stockings will average one inch shorter than the same styles in pre-war silk or nylon, because of the stretching qualities of rayon.

Hosiery will be limited to five colors in any style. This is hardly a wartime restriction, OWI said, since even in normal times few manufacturers had greater variety.

Under War Production board rulings, the stockings must be reinforced in foot and welt for extra wear.

When the price and marketing system goes into full effect in the next few months, every pair must carry marks identifying its quality.

The sheer rayon stocking of pre-war days is prohibited, although the government permits—but does not encourage—production of a new sheer rayon stocking made of a special type yarn and with a new mechanical technique.

Prisoners Exchanged By England and Italy

The Berlin radio, quoting advances from Rome, reported today that 269 Italian prisoners, including medical personnel and wounded, had been exchanged for 535 Britishers at Izmir, Turkey, on Thursday.

The exchange was in the presence of Turkish authorities and Red Cross Representatives.

JUNE 6—Red stamps L valid; M, June 13; N, June 20. All, including J and K, expire June 30. Each weekly series good for 16 points.

JUNE 7—Blue stamps G, H and J valid through this date. Blue stamps K, L and M good through July 7.

SUGAR

AUGUST 15—Stamp No. 13, book No. 1, good for five pounds, expires at midnight. Stamps No. 15 and No. 16 in war ration book one valid for 5 pounds of sugar each for home canning.

COFFEE

JUNE 30—Stamp No. 24, book No. 1, good for one pound, expires at midnight.

SHOES

JUNE 15—Stamp No. 17, book No. 1, valid for purchase of one pair of shoes, expires at midnight. Stamps are interchangeable within the family.

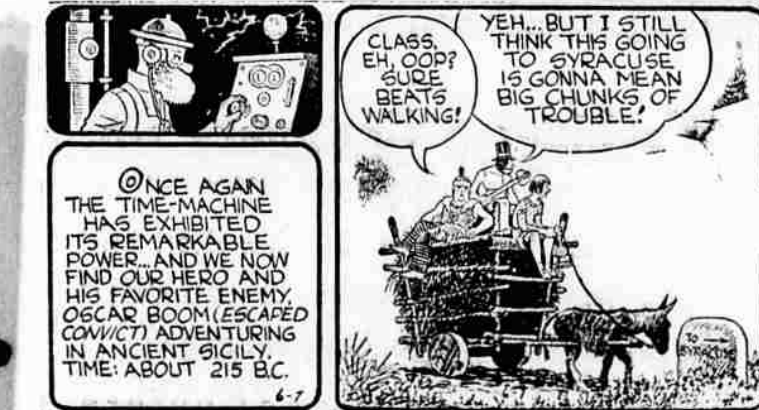

Youths 17 Now Eligible to Join U. S. Marines

The United States marine corps recruiting service announces that enlistment of 17-year-old boys are now open for a large number in June.

These 17-year-old boys are being selected with great care and those who are best fitted physically are being given the choice of calls. The boys who are nearest their 18th birthdays also receive a preference in the order of call. Boys who enlist under this program are being sent to Portland for a final physical examination and if found acceptable, they are being enlisted in the marine corps and then are placed on inactive duty. They return to their homes and remain there until called for active duty. That may mean a call at any time, but it is the policy, so far as it is possible, to leave these boys on the inactive lists until they have reached their 18th birthday.
