tended by Churchill, Gen. Marshall and Gen. Sir Alan Brooke, "but the finishing touches to the United Nations' summer campaign" and that Lieut. Gen. Mark W. Clark's Fifth U. S. Army would play a large role.

The invasion-conscious Germans clamped another state of emergency down on the Norwegian port of Bergen, a potential landing point, and it was disclosed that German defensive demolitions had blasted a 600-yard wide belt, with anti-tank ditches more than a mile from the sea, clear across the four miles of The Hague, Holland.

The Morocco radio reported new mass arrests of persons along the French coast who might have aided allied invaders. A Spanish report said Gibraltar was practically bare of shipping.

BUCKLAND, New Zealand, June 7—(AP)—Rear Admiral Theodore Wilkinson, deputy commander of the South Pacific area, disclosed today that a large body of United States troops recently came direct to New Zealand from the United States.

They now are training intensively before being sent to a combat zone, he said in a broadcast. Some troops also recently came to New Zealand after fighting at Guadalcanal. All except those suffering from malaria are training to return to combat.

strength into the defense of Pantelleria and some fierce air battles ensued when waves of American bombers and fighters went over the island yesterday.

The allied communique said eight of the enemy fighters were shot down and the Americans lost one plane. The Italians asserted seven of the raiders were accounted for.

The fiercest battle occurred when 50 American Liberators attacked Messina in Sicily, and San Giovanni and Reggio Calabria across the straits in Italy. They encountered 30 enemy fighters.

The Cairo communique said eight of the interceptors were shot down without an American loss.

The Italian communique said 50 persons were killed at Reggio Calabria.

Oil tanks, a power station, barracks and ferry terminals were hauled up by the falling bombs at the three places, the Americans said.

Reds Boost Plane Toll.

Citizens of Moscow looked forward to another significant week of aerial warfare today as they went to work reading of the red air force's reported achievements in knocking down 732 German planes to Russian losses of 212 from May 30 through June 5.

The week's air battles brought German losses to 2,821 planes during the last five weeks, Russian dispatches said.

The Soviet midday communique, recorded in London from a Moscow broadcast, said Russian bombers were active again last night, hammering at airbases behind the next lines in the Lishchansk area of the Donets river front.

A Berlin broadcast quoting DNB said German bombers also were active last night, again heavily raiding Gorki, important Russian armament center on the middle Volga east of Moscow.

Stepped-up artillery action and German attempts to force a Donets river crossing and counterattacks near Svyak, northwest of Kharkov, also were reported in the communique.

It said the German attempts to

cross the Donets and their strong Sevsk counterattacks were thrown back after scores of the enemy had been killed.

"Lifer" Escapes From Washington's Prison

WALLA WALLA, June 7—(AP)—Washington state prison officials announced the escape of Herbert Allen, Spokane murderer and bank robber, from the prison print shop early Saturday morning, Allen, convicted in 1938 with Le Roy and Stanley Knapp for the fatal shooting of a Spokane bank patron during a robbery, was serving a life sentence.

Le Roy Knapp died of gunshot wounds which he received when the trio tried unsuccessfully to break from Spokane county jail, and his brother was executed after he confessed firing the fatal shot. Allen's death sentence was commuted to life imprisonment by Governor Martin after Stanley Knapp confessed.

The sheriff's mounted posse has arranged cooperation with the U. S. forest service for guard and rescue duty in event of emergency. Sheriff Bud Carter announced today. The responsibility has been accepted at the request of the forest service, the sheriff stated.

The posse will be used in the event of incendiary bomb raids, crashed airplanes or in other cases where police guard service is necessary or rescue work is to be performed.

Arrangements have been made whereby pack and saddle horses will be kept available, together with trucks and trailers for transportation. Members have been assigned to the special contingent to be ready for departure upon call to any portion of the national forest.
