Buy Auto Stamp Now, Govt. Urges

The 1943-44 federal motor vehicle use stamps now are on sale at Douglas county post offices and motorists are being urged to buy the stamps at an early date and thus avoid a last-minute rush. Costing \$5, the stamps must be purchased on or before July 1.

They are serially numbered, gummed on the face, and have provisions on the back for the entry of the make, model, serial number and state license number of the motor vehicle. The tax stamp is transferable with the motor vehicle.

To guard against loss or theft, it is suggested that when affixing the stamp, the vehicle owner should dampen the windshield rather than the adhesive side of the stamp. Another effective method is to brush clear varnish over the stamp after it has been affixed. As an additional precaution it is suggested that each owner make a record of the serial number for his protection in the event the stamp should become lost. In Oregon all stamps are required to be placed in the upper left hand corner of the inside of the windshield.

Evangelist Finds Body Of Child in Rogue River

GRANTS PASS, Ore., June 17.—(AP)—The body of a two-year-old Lawrence Cooper, sought in the Rogue river since June 7, was found this morning caught in brush near a railroad bridge about one mile downstream from the child's home. Joseph Sherman, evangelist of the Church of Christ here, at the river for some early fishing, made the discovery.

The search for the child, son of Mr. and Mrs. O. C. Cooper, has been conducted by state and city police daily since the tragedy. The boy had followed his father to the chicken house perched on the bank of the river 30 feet above the water, and disappeared when Cooper stepped into the building. Their home is about two miles east of Grants Pass. Cooper is night man at Western Union here.

Giving Wine to Indians Brings Prison Term

PORTLAND, Ore. 17.—(AP)—Albert Haynes, 56, charged with furnishing wine to Indians at The Dalles on May 5, was sentenced by Federal Judge Fee yesterday to 13 months imprisonment and fined \$10.

Assistant U. S. Attorney William Langley said that Haynes, who previously had entered a plea of guilty, was on probation on a similar charge when he purchased the wine.

Ration Dates and Data

RATION BOOK NO. 2

JUNE 20—Red Stamps N valid. All, including J. K. L and M expire June 30. Each weekly series good for 16 points.

July 7—Blue stamps K, L and M good through this date.

SUGAR

AUGUST 15—Stamp No. 13, book No. 1, good for five pounds, expires at midnight. Stamps No. 15 and No. 16 in war ration book one valid for 5 pounds of sugar each for home canning.

COFFEE

JUNE 30—Stamp No. 24, book No. 1, good for one pound, expires at midnight.

SHOES

JUNE 16—Stamp No. 18, book No. 1, valid for one pair of shoes through October 31. Stamps interchangeable among family living in same household.

GASOLINE

JULY 21—"A" book expires. No. 6 stamps in "A" books valid through this date.

FUEL OIL

SEPTEMBER 30—Period 5 coupons valid March 26 through September 30. Heating coupons—one unit, value ten gallons; ten units, 100 gallons.

TIRES

Cars with B books must have tires inspected every 4 months; cars with C books every 3 months; cars with A books, every 6 months.
