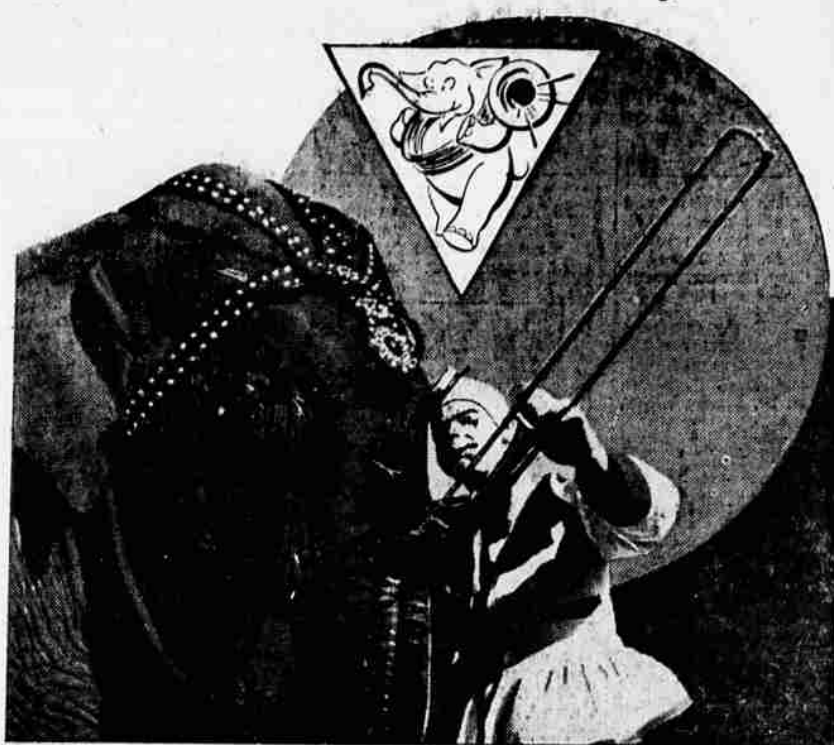
Cyprus is the third largest island in the Mediterranean, after Sicily and Sardinia.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., June 18.—(AP)—The state game commission's proposal to issue 6,000 doe deer tags in the Lake Klamath mule deer area this year came under fire of Klamath sportsmen yesterday.

A winter survey showed only 13,000 deer in the area, said John Ebinger, Izaak Walton league and Klamath Sportsmen's association president, and "if 6,000 of these are killed it will practically eliminate the breeding stock in these two counties."

port planes and 9,000 training planes, with spare engines and parts to keep them in action;

Furnish combat divisions with enough ammunition, tanks, small arms, cannon, combat vehicles and other equipment "to enable us to come to grips with and destroy the enemy."

Permit the maintenance of more than 900 airfields, 4,500 army posts, and 700,000 hospital beds, and provide for internment camps for 325,000 war prisoners.

Decisive Offensive Set
"We have passed from defensive to offensive action," General McNamery said after recalling that when last year's supply bill was passed the army had less than 2,500,000 men only partly trained and equipped and "we were in a precarious position, confronted with two aggressive, well-equipped and well-trained enemies on two fronts."

"Having driven the axis from Africa, we intend to deliver the knockout blow on the enemy's home grounds," he continued. "We have stemmed the forward movement of the Japs and are now in the process of evicting them from their conquests. Aerial warfare is being intensified... this will be followed at the propitious time by an all-out blow by both land and air. We will bring the war home to Japan, Germany and Italy."

The 7,533,000 enlisted strength of the army is the goal set for the end of this calendar year and includes an estimated 140,000 WAACS. It does not include 603,000 army and 10,000 WAAC officers.

The army's enlisted strength by the end of this month, declared General Comervell, will be 6,500,000 men, or almost twice its size at the end of the first world war.

Cannery to Operate at Roseburg Lumber Mill

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conserving products that might otherwise be wasted.

The canning process will be on a cooperative basis. The customer will furnish and prepare food for canning, doing the labor connected with blanching and placing the food in cans. The foreman of the plant will see that the cans are cooked, sealed and cooled.

Food will be canned in No. 21 tins at a fee of six cents per can, payment at the time the cans are removed from the cannery. The cans are to be purchased in wholesale lots of 1,000.

According to the Office of Price Administration, no family will be operated to can more than 100 quarts per person without surrendering ration points to the local board.

If sufficient interest is shown in this canning course, the plant will be operated five days weekly between the hours of 8 a. m. and 5 p. m. each day.

Residents of rural areas will have first choice on the use of facilities, but if not enough registers to utilize all the facilities, 30 per cent of the total enrollment may be accepted from the town population.

Any persons interested are requested to contact Mr. Grow, who will be at the junior high school from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m. Saturday to interview applicants. Persons unable to contact him personally at that hour may mail a post card, indicating intention to take the course and giving information on the number of cans to be required and the kinds of fruit and vegetables to be canned.
