Oregon Wood Rationing

Unnecessary, Snell Says

SALEM, Ore., June 30. (AP)—Governor Snell said today the new federal wood rationing program is unnecessary as far as Oregon is concerned.

"I regret that the program was adopted," Governor Snell said.

"Just a few days ago, Lynn Crone-miller (state solid fuels coordinator and deputy state forester) submitted a most encouraging report, showing that enough wood fuels will be available."

Under the program, wood deal-

ers will be required to issue permits for the purchase of wood.

The program is designed to insure that there will be enough wood to meet the needs of the state.

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
