Paratroop Deserters

Held as Bandit Suspects

SALEM, Ore., July 26.—(AP)—State Police Capt. Walter Lansing said today that the two men arrested at a dance hall near Albany last night have been identified as Kermit Barkhurst and Carl Bates, both about 28 and deserters from the army paratroopers.

Capt. Lansing said the men are being held in connection with two holdups in the Salem area, in which two automobiles were stolen.

The first occurred in the Buena Vista district when two men bound Leonard Phillips, 18, and Joyce Wilder, 16, and took Phillips' car after Phillips had given them a ride.

The second occurred near Mahama, when Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Burchfield, Lyons, were held up and their car stolen.

Ration Dates and Data

RATION BOOK NO. 2

JULY 31—Expiration date for red stamps P, Q, R and S (meats-fats). Red stamp T becomes valid July 25; U on August 1; V on August 8, and W on August 15—all expire August 31. Each weekly series good for 16 points.

AUGUST 7—Expiration date for blue stamps N, P and Q (processed foods) all of which became valid July 1. Blue stamps R, S and T will be valid from August 1 through September 7.

RATION BOOK NO. 1
SUGAR—AUGUST 15—Sugar stamp No. 13, good for five pounds, expires.

OCTOBER 31—Canning sugar stamps No. 15, 16 each good for five pounds, expire.

COFFEE—August 11—Stamp No. 22, good for one pound, expires. July 21 expiration date for coffee stamp No. 21.

SHUES—OCTOBER 31—Stamp No. 18, good for one pair of shoes through this date.

FUEL OIL

SEPTEMBER 30—Period 5 coupons valid March 26 through September 30. Heating coupons—One unit, value ten gallons; ten units, 100 gallons.

GASOLINE

SEPTEMBER 21—No. 7 stamps in new A book, each good for four gallons, valid through this date. July 21 expiration date of old "A" mileage ration books and No. 6 stamps—renewal forms available at service stations and ration boards.

TIRES

Cars with C ration books must have tires C inspected every 3 months; B books every 4 months; A books every 6 months. September 30 next inspection deadline for A book holders.
