Apple-Pear Spray Now For Moth Control Urged

CORVALLIS, July 30—(AP)—The third cover spray on apples and pears to control codling moth is now due in western Oregon, according to observations made by B. G. Thompson, associate entomologist of the OSC experimental station. He said second brood moths are laying eggs which will hatch by August 4.

Either calcium arsenate or lead arsenate is the standard control used in water at the rate of two to three pounds to 100 gallons.

SALEM, July 30—Hearings of a sub-group of the house public lands committee, in connection with a bill which would reimburse Oregon counties for lands taken over by the federal government and removed from the tax rolls, probably will be held in Eugene on August 11 and in Salem on August 12.
