RATION BOOK NO. 2
AUGUST 31—Expiration date of red stamps T, U, V and W (meats and fats). T series became valid July 25; U valid August 1; V on August 8, and W on August 15. Each weekly series good for 16 points.

AUGUST 7—Expiration date for blue stamps N, P and Q (processed foods) all of which became valid July 1. Blue stamps R, S and T will be valid from August 1 through September 7.

RATION BOOK NO. 1
SUGAR—AUGUST 15—Sugar stamp No. 13, good for five pounds, expires.

OCTOBER 31—Canning sugar stamps No. 15, 16 each good for five pounds, expire.

SHOES—OCTOBER 31—Stamp No. 18, good for one pair of shoes through this date.

FUEL OIL
SEPTEMBER 30—Period 5 coupons valid March 26 through September 30. Heating coupons—One unit, value ten gallons; ten units, 100 gallons.

GASOLINE
SEPTEMBER 21—No. 7 stamps in new A book, each good for four gallons, valid through this date. July 21 expiration date of old "A" mileage ration books and No.
