## Auto Mechanics Training Class to Be Conducted Here

An educational program for the training of automotive mechanics in this area will start at Roseburg Aug. 31, J. G. Giese, maintenance specialist of the Office of Defense Transportation for the Medford district, reported today.

The training classes will be conducted by certified instructors through the cooperation of the local automotive trade groups and the state board of vocational education, he said.

Due to the great number of men taken into the armed forces and men engaged in war production work, a critical shortage of mechanics and maintenance personnel has developed, Giese said. In order to alleviate this shortage, mechanics training programs have been established in a number of localities.

The training is free and all materials are furnished by the government. Anyone with a mechanical flair or background is invited to take advantage of the opportunity for expert training.

Applications will be received by the Dillard Motor company, Lockwood Motors, Orchard Auto Parts, Nordling Auto Parts and C. M. McDermott, Associated Oil Co. manager.

Only a limited number of applications can be accepted, Giese said, and candidates are urged to enroll immediately.
