

Roseburg Indians Defeat Reedsport In Opener, 25 to 6

The Roseburg high school Indians defeated Reedsport 25 to 6 in a football game at Reedsport Saturday, opening the season for both teams. With the score tied 6 to 6 at half-time, the Indians went to the lead early in the third quarter and capitalized on Reedsport's desperate passing in the final few minutes to add to the victory margin.

Reedsport scored early in the first period, when they recovered a fumbled pass from center and drove over the goal line from the 20-yard stripe.

Roseburg tied the score in the second quarter by a sustained drive of 60 yards, with Hooten, quarterback, carrying the ball on the scoring smash through the line.

The third quarter was played on even terms with neither team able to produce a serious threat. The Indians, however, started another march down the field as the final period opened, and drove through to the 10-yard line, where Hooten passed over the goal line to Marr.

Trailing 6 to 12, Reedsport took chances on a forward pass which was intercepted by Morgan, who ran to the Reedsport 18 from which point Hooten again passed to Marr, who crossed into scoring territory standing up.

Marr scored again a few minutes later when he, too, intercepted a pass, and raced 40 yards to score with Marsters clearing the way. Roseburg converted on that play to make the final score 25 to 6.

University High Billed

Roseburg's lineup was Hughes, left end; Currier, left tackle; Molschenbacher, left guard; Bashford, center; Turner, right guard and captain; Krell, right tackle; Horn, right end; Hooten, quarterback; Janelli, left halfback; Talley, right halfback; Marsters, fullback. Substitutes include Marr, halfback; Morgan, halfback; Phippen, guard; Knigge, center; Mitchell, guard; Dixon, tackle; Ulrich, end; Smith, end; Scallion, fullback.

Roseburg fans will have an opportunity to see the team in action here Friday night, when University high of Eugene plays on Finlay field, starting at 8 o'clock. The star of the Eugene team this season is Bill Holmstein, a member of Roseburg's last year's squad. As the district is divided into two divisions, with the Eugene school in the northern division and Roseburg in the southern division, the score Friday will not count in district standings. Roseburg, Cottage Grove and Springfield will play for the southern division title, with the winner meeting the victor in the northern division for the district championship and the right to go into the state title elimination contests.
