Separate Butter Ration Urged By Federation Head

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29—(AP)—Rationing of butter under a separate program was advocated by a leader of the industry today as the only way to assure fair distribution.

Criticizing as ineffective the OPA's new increase of the butter ration cost to 16 points, John Brandt of Minneapolis asserted in an interview that "no matter how many points are charged, there will be unjust shortages in some areas as long as butter is lumped under the same program with meats and other commodities."

Brandt, president of a large dairy company and of the National Cooperative Milk Producers' Federation, is conferring with farm and congressional leaders here on industry problems.

"When point values of meats and other products are substantially lower than the ration cost of butter, the logical result is that consumers transfer their point surpluses to butter purchases. This means that consumption continues heaviest in producer areas, leaving remote sections with little or no supply."

"The only way this situation can be corrected, Brandt argued, is to set up a separate butter rationing program so that relative values of other commodities will not influence butter sales."

Ration Tokens' Use Outlined by OPA

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2—(AP)—The OPA today outlined its plans for use of the ration tokens which will be put in circulation shortly in 1944.

"The tokens, to be used as change for processed foods and meats-fat stamps, will be made of plastic or glass, will be slightly larger than a nickel and will be inscribed to designate the foods for which they are good."

Bids on the manufacture of an initial supply of 900,000,000 of the discs will be opened here Monday.

Each token will have a value of one point and will have no expiration date. The blue ones will be used as change for processed food stamps and the red for red meats-fat stamps.

All red and blue stamps will be assigned a uniform value of 16 points when the tokens are placed in use, OPA said. Thus a customer making an eight-point blue stamp purchase would receive two blue tokens as change, to be used at any time.

Through the use of tokens and uniform stamp values, OPA expects war ration book 4 scheduled for distribution the last of this month, to last approximately two years.

The 15,000 participating ration banks will furnish dealers with their token supplies.

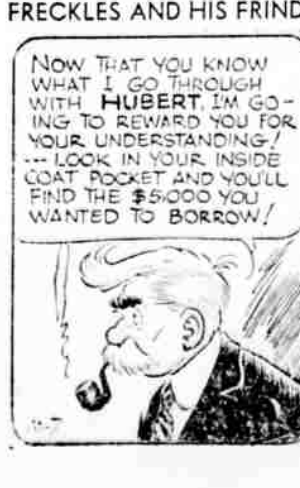

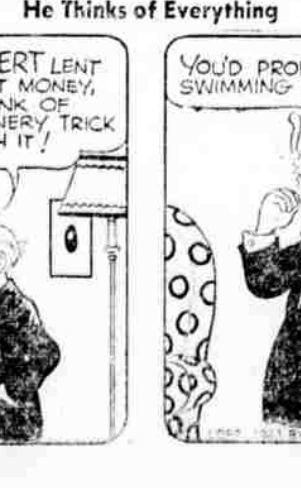
