## Public Fund Aids Lad To Get Grave Operation

**VANCOUVER, B. C., Oct. 20** — (AP) — Eight-year-old Melvin Gilliland will leave here Monday night bound for Temple university clinic at Philadelphia where it is hoped doctors can remove an iron staple that has been lodged in his lung for more than a year.

Melvin will be accompanied by his mother, Mrs. Norman Gilliland, on a trip made possible through a fund that began after publication of his plight in a newspaper and realized about \$1,400 in little more than a week.

The lad swallowed the staple while playing in Star City, Sask., where his parents lived before coming to Vancouver. Three operations without surgery were unsuccessful in removing the staple. His parents did not have the money to take Melvin to the Philadelphia hospital where such operations were reported to have been successful.

## Mussolini Would Quit As Fascist Party Head

**BERN, Switzerland, Oct. 20** — (AP) — A Budapest dispatch to the Swiss newspaper Gazette de Lausanne said today that Benito Mussolini had indicated his intention to resign as head of Italy's "fascist republican government" and had asked the directors of the party in Berlin to name Marshal Rodolfo Graziani as his successor.

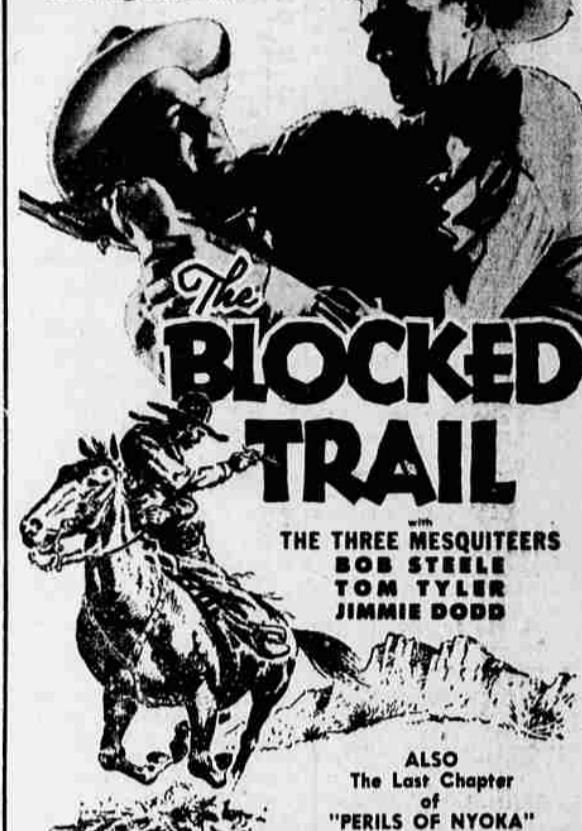
The dispatch said the former duce never had left Germany, although he was reported to have returned to Rome from Germany after his "liberation" by Nazi parachutists. Italians in Budapest, the dispatch added, said that Mussolini had never actively participated in the new government, which was "against his heart."
