Mussolini Would Quit As Fascist Party Head

BERN, Switzerland, Oct. 20-(AP)—A Budapest dispatch t the Swiss newspaper Gazette De Lausanne said today that Benito Mussolini had indicated his intention to resign as head of Italy's "fascist republican government" and had asked the directors of the party in Berlin to name Marshal Rodolfo Graziani is his successor.

The dispatch said the former duce never had left Germany, although he was reported to have returned to Rome from Germany after his "liberation" by nazi parachutists, Italians in Budapest, the dispatch added, said that Mussolini had never actively participated in the new govern ment, which was "against his
