Employers Told to File Returns on Withheld Tax

J. W. Maloney, collector of Internal Revenue, today called to the attention of all employers who are required to withhold income tax from the wages of their employees that the returns of this tax are now due and must be filed with the office of the Collector of Internal Revenue, Portland, Oregon, not later than

October 31, 1943. Mr. Maloney said that unusually severe penalties are imposed under this new act for any failure to file the return in time to reach the collector's office within the time specified above. There is a minimum addition to the tax of \$20 for failure to file return and pay the tax when due. Collector Maloney urges employers to avoid this penalty by mailing their returns in time to reach his office not later than October 31, 1943.

Pacific College to Battle Trojans in Major Grid Test

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 21—(AP)—The "Grand Old Man" of football, Amos Stagg, seemingly has only one more hurdle to accomplish with his amazing College of the Pacific team to insure an invitation to the Rose Bowl New Year's game.

If the Staggmen can beat the heavy, experienced and widely-spread Trojans of Southern California here Saturday in one of the nation's outstanding contests, there are only three minor foes for Pacific to conquer. Even if the military service cuts deeply into the 81-year-old grid master's personnel, he should have enough left to beat St. Mary's Nov. 6 and the Pleasanton, Calif., Navy in the windup.

Under Pacific Coast conference arrangements with the Rose Bowl committee, the conference champion always is the western representative, but this year Washington alone represents the northern division, and Stanford's withdrawal left only California, UCLA and Southern California in the southern sector. The selection should and probably will be the outstanding team on the West coast.

If Pacific can beat the Trojans it is the best team by any yardstick Stagg, tossed aside 10 years ago by the University of Chicago as too old, is tossing off 54 ears of football coaching with one of the most sensational achievements in football history.

He has enunciated four surprises in five eras and his onset of the star-studded Del Monte Pre-Flights last week convinced football followers in northern California that Pacific could and MIGHT beat the unscored-on Trojans.

The Southern California camp is confident it will turn back the Stagg threat. It has speed to burn—far more speed than any other team the Tigers have encountered.

Indians of R. H. S. Face Junction City Gridders Friday

The Roseburg high school Indians journey to Junction City Friday to play a Kline-X football game. Coach Turner reports that Billy Turner and Pat Jannelli probably will see only limited action, as Turner has not been feeling well and Jannelli has a sore leg.

The backfield combination, however, is expected to be stronger than in any previous game, as a new combination, which resulted when Plonen was drawn out of the line from the tackle position and shifted into a halfback spot, has given some badly needed speed in that department.

Junction City has lost to both Springfield and University high this year, and Roseburg lost to the latter team by a close margin.

Next week Springfield will come to Roseburg for a night game, which will count in district standings, and promises to be one of the best of the season as comparative figures would indicate the two teams to be closely matched.
