Little Basement Shop Proves Boon In Needs of War

PORTLAND, Oct. 29—(AP)—The Smith brothers—Dale, Sibley and McKee—offered proof today that small business can do a big war job.

The Smiths had a little basement shop in their office outfitting store before the war. Now they have seven teeming machine shops because they manufactured vital equipment that couldn't be obtained elsewhere.

Their previous specialty was repairing safes. A shipyard wanted some of that work done and they did it. Then came a yard request for ship galley equipment, and they turned that out, too.

Came a request for manually operated foghorns for ships. No one else had them, so the Smith brothers made them. Since then they've made virtually everything that ships require not readily available from other sources.

The Smiths say their record is due largely to employees who work with them, not for them. They cited last winter's order for vital gun parts that was being filled during a paralyzing snowstorm.

"We laid the cards on the table and told our employees the need for these parts. They stayed on the job and slept at the plant in order to turn out the work," they said.

Outdoor Sports Given Credit for Troops' Skill

SEATTLE, Oct. 29—(AP)—Pacific northwest soldiers, proving themselves the equals of any fighting men in the world in action, G. in the South Pacific, once their adaptation to the versatility of the outdoor sports to which they have been accustomed in civilian life, War Correspondent Arthur I. Burgess said here last night.

Burgess, brought back to the states after he was stricken with malaria, credited the statement of Col. James Dalton and added: "He told me some of them make the best tree climbers he's ever seen, and they don't think anything of packing 45 pounds of supplies on their backs through the Jap-infested jungle."

"The Japs are good, courageous fighters; make no mistake about that. Right now we have the ball, but we're scarcely out of the shadows of our own goal posts."

Working together on the program are Rep. Coffee (D-Wash.), Rep. Sheppard (D-Calif.) and Rep. Angell (R-Ore.). Coffee is chairman of the house section of the decentralization of heavy industries committee of congress, recently organized by Sen. McCarran (D-Nev.). Sheppard is chairman of the west coast house subcommittee on the west coast aluminum committee.

Coffee said the outstanding problem confronted by the committee is the government's plan to deny war contracts to junior industries in favor of the big war plants directly concerned with production of war materials, but also said that government improvement of transportation, housing, schools and day nurseries should be sought to prevent the return to their former homes of many workers unable to find suitable living accommodations.

"The supposed manpower shortage on the west coast is an effect and is not a cause," Coffee said.

Angell said the joint delegations would seek development of steel, coal and other industries on the west coast.

"The whole western area is in the same boat," Angell said. "We are trying to make ourselves felt through concerted action."
