The conference followed the regular meeting of the Roseburg club which was entertained at its luncheon by Dean Theodore Kruit, director of the school of music at University of Oregon.

Dean Kruit gave a most interesting talk on music appreciation, demonstrating at the piano the methods used in developing themes and harmony.
