CAPTAIN AND MRS. MURRAY STOP OVER IN ROSEBURG EN ROUTE TO MISSOURI

Mrs. Murray will be remembered as the former Mary Elizabeth Holaday, junior high school English teacher in 1939-1941.

Captain Murray is returning after two years duty in Alaska with the Alaska Communication system. He will report to the signal corp officers' replacement pool at Camp Crowder for reassignment. While he was engaged in installing a signal corps radio station at Dutch Harbor, Alaska, he witnessed the Japanese bombing there on June 3-4, 1942. Later he was with the first American landing wave on Attika Island, in the far western Aleutians, and was bombed fourteen times by the Japs from Kiska, sixty-eight miles distant.
