

Amnesia Victim Finds Wife Wed To Another Man

PORTLAND, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Allen E. Miller, who came back home after seven years to find his wife married to another man, bowed out of the triangle today.

Miller, missing from home since a month before his daughter was born in November, 1936, told Police Captain James Fleming he apparently was a victim of amnesia. He said he remembered nothing before 1937, when he was in Texas.

Miller said he recently discovered papers indicating he had a wife and child here so he returned to investigate. He said he did not recognize his wife, now Mrs. M. E. Atkinson, when police arranged a meeting yesterday.

Apartment Rent Rules To Be Relaxed, Report

PORTLAND, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Oregon apartment operators

heard today that rent regulations were due to be relaxed soon but the OPA said it had not been informed of any plans to alter ceilings.

W. A. Carpenter told the Oregon Apartment House association, of which he is president, that the national association informed him OPA was planning to aid landlords who have suffered losses from frozen rents without waiting for congressional action.

Poultry Culling Urged in Need of Feed Conservation

Rigid culling of laying flocks this January will be unusually important as a means of reducing flocks in line with feed supplies and in affording more efficient and profitable production, according to County Agent J. Roland Parker. Poultry producers of Douglas county, as well as those in the entire nation, are faced with an adjustment problem this spring, he says.

Information on both the national and state January culling campaign has been received by the county agent from Noel Bennion, extension poultry specialist at Oregon State college, who also makes some suggestions on culling procedures.

Oregon has expanded her production of chickens, eggs and turkeys to such an extent in response to national demands that some reduction is suggested in state goals for 1944. These goals call for 4 per cent fewer eggs, 1 per cent fewer chickens raised, 26 per cent less broiler production, and 8 per cent fewer turkeys raised for meat.

From the national standpoint it is hoped through January culling to reduce an estimated 520 million hens and pullets by approximately 50 million. If Oregon poultrymen will reduce flocks to the approximate number on hand in January a year ago, they will obtain more efficient egg production and conserve vital feedstuffs, Bennion suggests. This can be done by eliminating older birds not in laying condition and by removing undersized, slow maturing pullets. A ready market is available for these as soon as culled and with no further feeding.

Bennion also calls attention to present indications that turkey breeders are planning to carry over even more breeding hens this year than the record number a year ago. The same holds true of other Pacific coast states and even other parts of the country.

While there is a strong demand for hatching eggs from Oregon broadbreasted flocks, which insures a good market for early eggs, there is some question about the later season market. Excess breeders can be sold at a profit now, whereas if too many are kept, there may be difficulties with inadequate feed supplies and a possible short season of egg demand.

Oregon-Grown Onions Released to Civilians

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 5.—(AP)—About 2,400,000 pounds of Oregon-Grown Dry Onions, originally scheduled for shipment to Puerto Rico and other Caribbean points, have been released into civilian trade, the Food Distribution Administration said today.

There is a threatened shortage in the next few weeks because of heavy army demands and diversion of large quantities of onions to dehydrators, the FDA explained.
