## U. S. National Bank's Deposits Upped Heavily

In the year-end financial statement submitted to the comptroller of currency as per official call of December 31, the United States National bank, which has one of its important branches in this city, showed deposits of \$390,055,770.62, compared with deposits at the close of last year of \$294,702,266.64, a gain of \$95,353,503.98.

A review of deposits over the past ten-year period made by Mr. J. H. Booth, head of the local branch of the bank, shows figures as of December 30, 1933, of \$75,210,343.29 against latest reported deposits of \$390,055,770.62, or a gain in the decade of \$314,845,427.33.
