Argentine Govt. Puts "Choker" on Press of Nation

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 6 (A.P.)—Strong new curbs brought the Argentine Press and Foreign correspondents under strict control today of the government of President Ramirez, who seized power in last June's military revolt.

A decree issued yesterday specifically prohibited news, editorials and advertising which "disturb the good relations the Nation maintains with friendly countries," or contain statements prejudicial to public officials, private institutions and private citizens generally.

At the same time newspapers were required to publish communiques and other official information as the subcategory of press directs and in the form he specifies. A separate decree that motion picture theaters to devote at least eight minutes of each program to Argentine propaganda reels.

Enrollment in an official register is required of all persons engaged in any phase of news gathering and publishing, with registry barred to those convicted of crimes or who "repeatedly violate the provisions of this decree."

Four decrees of punishment for infractions were set up—A warning, suspension of the publication, removal from the official register of all concerned closure and seizure of the fixtures of the offending publication or news agency.

Prominent Baptist Worker to Speak Here

Miss Isabelle Gates of Portland, Christian Friendliness worker of the Woman's American Baptist Home Mission society, is a special guest of the Roseburg Baptist church at the present time. Miss Gates is a graduate of Linfield college and Berkeley Divinity school. She has worked with the following groups of foreign-born people: Chinese, Japanese, Mexicans, Greeks, Hungarians, Italians, Russians and German refugees. She has also worked with Negroes. With government approval Miss Gates has made two trips to the Mindoka center at Hunt, Idaho. Miss Gates will be a special pulpit guest at the Baptist church this coming Sunday evening, discussing experiences she has had among the above groups of people.

Local Scout Heads to Attend Training Course

P. J. Motschenbacher, Paul Geddes and Mervin Brown, the commissioners for the Douglas county Boy Scout organization, will attend the training course for commissioners and scoutmasters being given at Marshfield this Saturday and Sunday, according to Bruce Elliott, district chairman.

The course will be a two-fold affair with part of the program planned for commissioners and part for scoutmasters. The scoutmasters' course will be the same as that given at Roseburg three weeks ago.

Both courses will be conducted by K. A. Wells, scout executive, assisted by Ralph Kalahar and Judson Compton. Men are expected for the training from Marshfield, North Bend, Eastside, Coquille, Myrtle Point, Bandon, Powers, Reedsport and Gardiner in addition to the local men attending.
