## Sutherlin's Growth Spurred by Lumber Industry

Schetty, manager of the company's sawmill at Sutherlin, Oregon, formerly known as the Schetty Fisher Lumber company.

"We will enlarge our plant here as circumstances warrant and as war conditions enable us to secure building material," Mr. Morris told me. "We now are employing about 125 men in the mill here, and in the woods east of town at our logging camp. We use sawlogs from our timber holdings here, converting them into lumber. The peelers are shipped to our plywood mill in Springfield."

Pictured in the strip above is the newly completed Federal Public Housing authority's new units in Sutherlin, consisting of 100 apartments, plus administration and other buildings.

Erected by the Halvorson Construction company of Salem, 65 per cent of the apartments are ready for occupancy. They range in size up to three-bedroom suites and are furnished with city (Copco) water and lights. William Willis superintended the company's Sutherlin construction job.

An undetermined number of workers, both AFL and non-union, reported at the plant, but were barred by pickets.

A "show cause" hearing ordered by the Regional War Labor board to be conducted at Seattle has been postponed until Wednesday. The three unions involved, CIO and two affiliated with the AFL, are to be represented at the hearing.

## Repeat Violation Of Traffic Code Brings New Fines
