Value of gasoline coupons—A, B1, C1, 3 gals.; B2, C2, R and T, 5 gals.; D, 1.5 gals.; E, 1 gal.

TIRES Cars with C ration books must have tires inspected every 3 months. B books every 4 months; A books every 6 months. Commercial motor vehicles—tire inspection every 6 months or every 5,000 miles, whichever comes first.

RATIONING CALENDAR (Clip and keep for handy reference.) **RATION BOOK NO. 3** (Brown Stamps) for purchase of meats-fats, etc.

JANUARY 1, 1944—Expiration date of brown stamps L, M, N, P, and Q.
