Revised Scale for Profits Tax Voted

WASHINGTON, Jan. 15.—(AP)—The senate declined today to lower the point at which excess profits taxes are applied on corporations but adopted a revised scale affecting large concerns. Taking up the \$2,275,000,000 tax bill, the senate refused to adopt an amendment, proposed by Senator Burton, providing for a revised scale of excess profits credits, based on invested capital. Senator George, chairman of the finance committee, said Burton's proposal would "cut too deeply" into federal revenues.

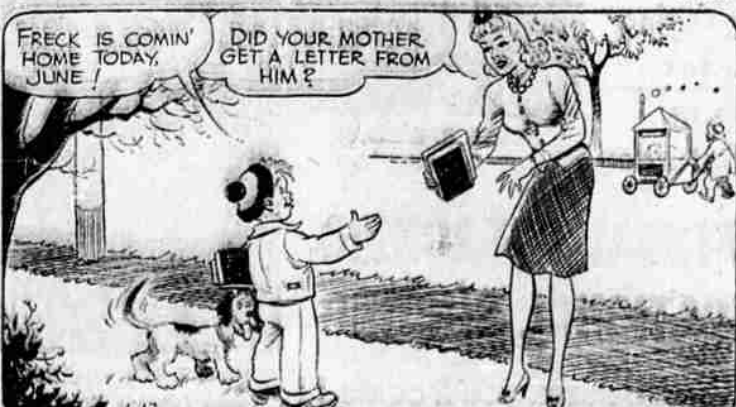
