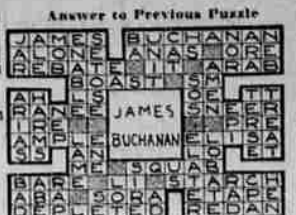

Ration Violation Charged Against Local Gas Seller

In the first Douglas county OPA hearing involving alleged violations of rationing regulations, R. O. Johnson, operator of the Johnson Richfield station in Roseburg, was held by Robert Dulin, Portland, hearing commissioner, to have sold gasoline without an exchange of valid coupons; to have sold gasoline on unendorsed coupons and to have an existing inventory shortage. The hearing was conducted last night at local OPA headquarters.

A 30-day suspension of business was ordered, but the order was suspended conditional upon future compliance, Marvin Hixon, legal investigator for the OPA, reported.

Miss Pat Gallagher, Portland, OPA attorney, represented the federal agency. Johnson appeared as his own attorney, contending any errors were unintentional and were due to shortage of help and lack of time to maintain the records demanded by the OPA.

The commissioner's order recommended that the local board refuse to make up the inventory shortage, an act which would reduce the station's replacement capacity, Hixon stated.

Railroad Spur Planned By Gardiner Mill Co.

REEDSPORT, Ore., Jan. 18.—(AP)—Plans to construct a two-mile railroad spur from Gardiner to East Gardiner were announced today by the Gardiner Lumber Mill company.

O. H. Hinsdale, president, said the \$75,000 project would enable the firm to handle products once instead of three times.

Construction awaits a permit from the state highway commission for the track to cross the Coast highway.
