## Awards Slated at Annual Meet Here Of Scout Council

In keeping with the time Wallamet Area council, Boy Scouts of America, will hold its annual meeting in four sections, according to B. C. Elliott, local district Scout chairman. The first of the four sections of the annual meeting will be held in Roseburg on Saturday evening, February 12. It will be a dinner meeting, to which are being invited all of the Boy Scout and Cub leaders of the county and their wives.

Those attending will be privileged to hear as principal speaker Dr. William Jones, professor of political science at University of Oregon. Dr. Jones is an outstanding speaker and a leader in his chosen field.

Other features on the program will include reports on scouting and cubbing throughout the area council, the award of an Eagle Scout badge to Elliott Mutschbacher, award of 4th War Loan ribbons to those troops that earn them through their part in the drive, award of training course certificates to the many scoutmasters and commissioners who have completed training during 1943, and finally the award of the Silver Beaver. This is the highest award granted by the National Council of Boy Scouts of America to local adult scouters for outstanding work with boys through scouting. Those receiving the award are limited in number and their names are not revealed until the actual time of presentation.

## V-Mail Use in Letters To Service Men Urged

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 27—(AP)—The navy, operating in San Francisco the largest V-mail station in the world, said today that unless the folks at home become "more V-mail minded" it may become necessary to discontinue carrying other personal mail overseas by air. Recognizing the great part that letters from home play in the morale of the men on the fighting fronts, the navy urged that they

be dispatched by V-mail. V-mail letters are photographic on microfilm, and 1,700 of them weigh a total of only six ounces, while 1,700 ordinary letters weigh about 24 pounds.
