PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 29.—(AP)—Unable to continue after three five-minute rest periods, Costello Cruz, 165, won on a foul from Jack Chase, 159, Pacific coast middleweight boxing champion, in the fourth round of their scheduled 10-round non-title bout last night.

The two battlers, who fought to a draw here a year ago, punched an even terms in the first round, with Chase taking the second and third with a strong attack to the head which had Cruz groggy.

Cruz rallied in the fourth, backed Chase to the ropes, and caught a left in the groin as he charged in. Cruz manager claimed a foul and three separate five-minute rest periods were given the Californian in an effort to put him back into fighting shape.

Preliminary results: Lefty Abbott, 158, Bellingham, scored three-round technical knockout over Roy Dunn, 159, Vancouver, in scheduled six-round semi-windup; Mel Roberts, 138, Portland, defeated Jimmy Hogan, 143, Seattle, six rounds.

Angott, Jack Battle to Draw in Ten Rounder

NEW YORK, Jan. 29.—(AP)—Beau Jack and Sammy Angott, rival lightweight champions of the world, still have their titles after last night's 10-round draw at Madison Square garden.

Angott who came out of the fight with a leg injury, got away in front with a fine exhibition of outboxing the Beau but was shaken up in the second by a hard left hook to the head.

He was clutching and hitting with his free paw in his familiar style throughout the middle rounds as the Beau first tried to outbox then to outlug his foe.

Jack scored repeatedly with a right hand and both men slipped down for no counts in the seventh when Angott enjoyed his widest margin.

RHS Cagers Lose Second Straight to Cavemen, 41 to 26

Roseburg's season record of splitting basketball games with opponents was broken last night when the Indians collapsed under a sustained third-period drive by the Grants Pass Cavemen and were beaten 41 to 26 in a game at Grants Pass. Grants Pass also won Friday night's game, inflicting two defeats in a row on the Redskins.

Last night's contest followed the pattern of several previous contests in which the Indians have engaged, with the Roseburg team playing capable ball during the first two periods, but going to pieces after the rest period.

The two teams played an even first quarter in which the score was tied at 5-all. The second quarter also was nip-and-tuck with the Cavemen holding a one-point advantage, 12 to 11, at half-time.

Smith and Rebel opened up the long-range assault on the Roseburg basket as the third period opened, connecting with several long shots which quickly put Grants Pass well out in front.

The Roseburg defense collapsed under the assault and the Cavemen piled up a wide margin.

The game was much more cleanly played than Friday night's game, which was rough and ragged. Ten fouls were called on Roseburg players last night and 11 on the Cavemen.

The Indians will play two games here next week, Feb. 4 and 5, against Medford.
