Oregon Men Held As War Prisoners Receive Comforts

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 31—(AP)—There are now 360 service men from Oregon who are held in war prison camps, according to a compilation made by War Prisoners Aid, Y. M. C. A., a participating service of the National War Fund, according to reports received by Charles A. Sprague, president of Oregon War Chest.

War Prisoners Aid, Y. M. C. A., which is supported in part by contributions made to National War Fund through the Oregon War Chest, provides recreational, cultural and spiritual assistance to war prisoners, under provisions of the Geneva convention of 1929.

"Although the men from Oregon may be adequately fed," said Mr. Sprague, "they still face the problem of an endless procession of months of prison life. Taken suddenly from active, exciting lives as soldiers, cut off from news of world developments, and with nothing to occupy their minds and hands, they can easily give way to bitterness and despair. To help prevent this 'barbed wire disease,' War Prisoners Aid carries on its work, through neutral representatives who make regular visits to prison camps, learn their needs and endeavor to meet them.

"War Prisoners Aid, Y. M. C. A. now has nearly one hundred representatives working in prison camps and shipped approximately half a million tons of recreational and cultural material to the prison camps last year, including books, sports equipment, musical instruments, and materials for the comfort of the men."

War Relief Services of National Catholic Welfare conference and World Student Service Fund, are also participating services of the National War Fund, doing work with war prisoners.

PORTLAND, Jan. 31—(AP)—The state game commission Saturday adopted 1944 fishing regulations tentatively announced at its December meeting. The limit on jack salmon, now limited to six, will be removed February 1. Effective on the same date, the limit on steelheads from coast streams will be reduced from five in one day or 10 in a week to three in one day or nine in a week.
