Pope Accused Of Being Pro-Fascist

MOSCOW, Feb. 2 (AP)—Writing in the official soviet newspaper Izvestia, Dmitri Petrov called Pope Pius XII pro-fascist and said "no wonder hate of Hitler and Mussolini now also includes the vatican."

"Catholics who live in England, America, Spain, Poland and other countries as well as the Italians are becoming convinced of the pro-fascist character of the vatican's policy," he said yesterday. "The vatican has assumed the position of direct accomplice of fascism," Petrov asserted.

"The pope's declaration of equal love for all people on the fourth anniversary of the war and on Christmas, 1943, does not affirm with the vatican's practical policy which not only has maintained diplomatic relations with Hitler, but helped Hitler strangle the Italian people, including Catholic groups opposed to fascism in Germany, as well as in Italy."
