OILMEAL ALLOCATION

The first February allocation of oilseed meal for Oregon from the 20 per cent which processors are required to set aside from their February production of directed distribution by WFA has been received by the state AAA office.

The allocation is approximately the same as that received in January, and will meet about a third of the state's total livestock and poultry feed needs.
