Anzio beachhead. The grim determination with which the Germans are fighting betrays their conviction that it is a GOOD plan.

BERLIN gets its 15th and heaviest attack from the air, 1000 heavy bombers dropping 2800 tons on it.

Since last November 18, Berlin has been heavily bombed 15 times with 28,000 tons of explosives.

With a crew of more than 10 each, that runs into quite a personnel loss—which, however is insignificant in comparison with the cost of inflicting equal loss on Berlin by a land campaign.

THE Russians are steadily liquidating the Germans caught in the Cherkasy trap.

Note the similarity under the skin of the Nazi Germans and the Japs.

FINLAND is reported to be in direct negotiation with Russia.

Col. General Dietl, in command of the 7 German divisions in Finland, is reported to have advised Hitler to WITHDRAW these men in order to avoid their entrapment.

IN the Southwest Pacific, American and New Zealand troops occupy the Green Islands, at the extreme northern tip of the Solomons group.

General MacArthur announces that this move isolates 22,000 Japs left in the Solomons and "for all strategic purposes completes the 19-month-old campaign there."

MACARTHUR then asserts that Japan cannot be defeated through blockade and bombing alone.

He adds: "We must defeat Japan's army, and for that purpose our strategy must devise ways and means to bring our GROUND forces into contact with Japan's ground forces at decisive points."

RECALL Admiral Nimitz' recent statement that we must force our way westward across the Pacific to a LANDING on the SHORES OF CHINA.

Whatever Washington may think about it, it is evident that our high commanders in the Pacific are thoroughly convinced that the Jap war is a REAL war.

PROVIDING minor trimmings for the war news, pro-German army officers in Argentina have staged another coup of some sort.
