The commission adjourned yesterday after two days' discussion of the cases and announced a decision probably would be made next week.

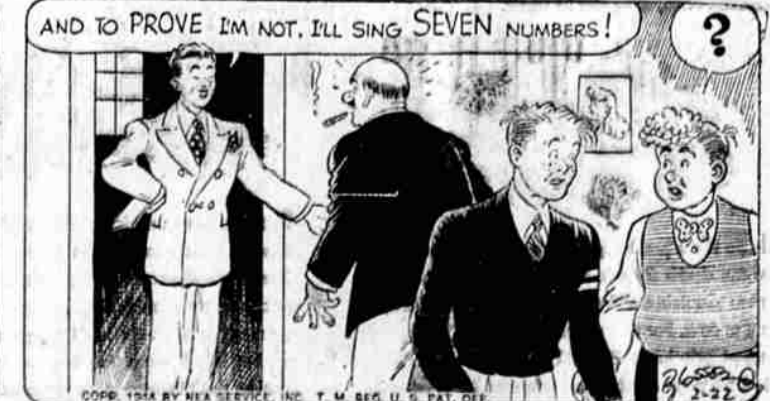
