Communists Intervene In Harry Bridges Case

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 22—(AP)—The communist party of the United States has filed a circuit court plea of intervention in the Harry Bridges deportation hearing, with the assertion it desires "to clear its name of charges it advocates the overthrow of this government by force and violence."

Attorney J. R. Brodsky of New York filed the plea yesterday in the name of his clients, William Z. Foster, national party chairman, and Earl Browder, general secretary and one-time presidential candidate.

The U. S. circuit court of appeals will hear the Bridges' appeal to a deportation order of U. S. Attorney General Biddle on March 6.

Jap Internment Camp in Arkansas to Be Closed

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22—(AP)—Interior Secretary Ickes announced today that one of the ten Japanese communities operated by the War Relocation authority—the center at Jerome, Ark.—will be abandoned in June as an economy move. It will be the first center to be closed.

There are 6,554 Japanese-American evacuees at Jerome. They will be moved to other centers, about 2,000 going to the other Arkansas center at Rohwer and the rest to centers farther west.

Because of the WRA program of getting the Japanese-Americans out of the centers as fast as they could be given jobs—and so long as they were acceptable to the communities receiving them—the peak population of 107,000 in the centers has declined to 92,000.

Two-thirds of them are American citizens.

Time for Filing Tax Estimates Is Extended

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22—(AP)—The treasury today formally announced a 30-day extension of time for filing declarations of estimated income and victory tax for 1944, although emphasizing no delay would be granted for filing 1943 tax returns due March 15.

Originally intended to complement the 1943 returns, the estimating procedure was delayed pending presidential action on the new revenue bill.

The procedure will be similar to that of last September, with both long and short forms again
