U. of O. Cagers Defeat Cougars in Race Finale

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 24.—(AP)—The University of Oregon Web-foots completed their conference schedule last night with a season record of 11 victories clinaxed by last night's 56 to 44 trimming of Washington state, against five defeats.

The standing anchored Oregon securely in second place behind the undefeated Washington Huskies, whose 12 victories include four over Oregon. The only other game Oregon dropped was one to Washington state.

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
