F. R. in Seclusion Because of "Flu"

WITH THE PRESIDENTIAL PARTY, Feb. 25.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, slow to shake off effects of a recent attack of influenza, is getting a measure of rest and relaxation away from politically stormy Washington. He is isolated personally from representatives of the press.

But it would be inaccurate to say that he is isolated also from the repercussions of his veto of the second wartime tax bill since special facilities permit him almost instant communication with the White House.

The chief executive himself had disclosed that he was out of town when he urged Senate Majority Leader Barkley not to resign in protest against the tax bill veto. Mr. Roosevelt contracted influenza shortly after Christmas and the case was severe enough to drop his weight 10 pounds. His personal physician, Ross T. McIntire, had been urging him to get out of the capital, to take it easy for a time and regain his strength.

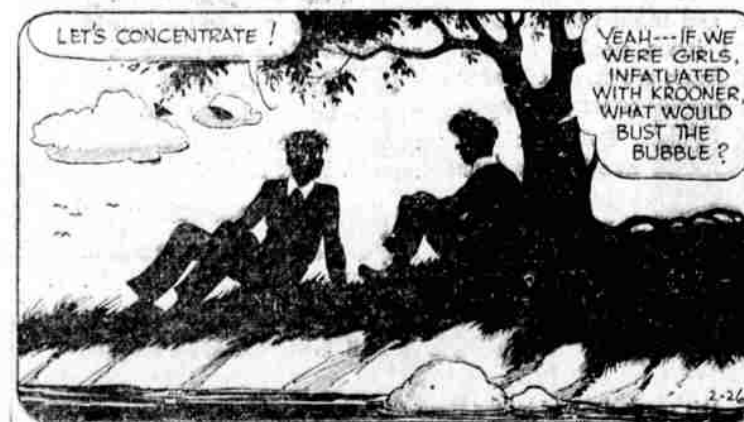
