**Chaplin Pleads Innocent
Of 2 Mann Act Violations**

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 26.—(AP)—Charlie Chaplin pleaded innocent today to two counts of Mann act violation.

His pleas followed a ruling by U. S. Dist. Judge J. F. T. O'Connor rejecting a demurrer by the actor's counsel to grand jury indictments and a motion to quash the charges.

Chaplin's trial was set to start March 21.

The 54-year-old Chaplin is accused of Mann act violation for allegedly transporting Miss Joan Berry, 24, his former protegee, to New York with immoral objectives. With six others he also is accused of conspiring to deprive Joan of her constitutional rights by seeking to compel her to leave the state after a quarrel.
