Ceiling Prices on Womens Apparel Are Surveyed Here

A number of discrepancies in ceiling prices on women's wearing apparel are being investigated following a survey made recently in Roseburg stores, according to L. V. Hammock, chairman of the War Price and Rationing board for the Roseburg area. Dale B. Lindsay, district price liaison officer, C. W. Nevius, Frank Ward, Mrs. Peggy Molloy and Miss Mary Helen Nelson, price specialists from the district office in Portland, spent three days in Roseburg as a part of a state wide survey of prices maintained by dealers in women's apparel, Hammock stated.

The survey is a compliance check, designed to determine compliance with outlined methods for arriving at markups and ceiling prices, it was stated. Reports of findings were made to the price panel of the Roseburg board and a conference was held at which local representatives were instructed concerning follow-up methods and educational activities.



RATIONING CALENDAR

(Clip and keep for handy reference.)

RATION BOOK NO. 3

(Brown stamps) for purchase of meats, fats, etc.

MARCH 20—Expiration date of brown stamps Y and Z. Each weekly series good for 16 points. (8, 5, 2, 1-point values.)

RATION BOOK NO. 4

(Processed fruits and vegetables, jams and jellies.)

MARCH 20—Expiration date of green stamps K, L and M. (8, 5, 2, 1-point values.)

MAY 20—Expiration date of red stamps A, B, C, D, E, F and G in ration book No. 4 (meat, butter, fats, cheese, canned milk, canned fish, oils). Each stamp has a 10-point value. Series A, B, C and D valid now. Series E, F and G valid on March 12.

MAY 20—Expiration date of blue stamps A, B, C, D, E and F in ration book No. 4 (processed fruits and vegetables, jams and jellies). All valid now. Each stamp has a 10-point value.

SUGAR

MARCH 31—Expiration date of stamp 30, in Book Four, good for 5 pounds.

SHOES

Stamp No. 18, book one, and "Airplane" stamp No. 1, book three, valid for one pair each for indefinite period.

STOVES

Purchasers must get certificates at ration boards for most new stoves.

WOOD, SAWDUST, COAL

Fuel dealers deliver by priorities based on needs.

FUEL OIL

MARCH 13—Expiration date of period 3 coupons.

GASOLINE

MARCH 21—Expiration date of No. 10 stamps.

Value of gasoline coupons—A, B1, C1, 3 gals.; B2, C2, R and T, 5 gals.; D, 1.5 gals.; E, 1 gal.

Coupons must be endorsed as soon as received—your protection against the black market.

TIRES

Cars with C ration books must have tires inspected every 3 months. B books every 4 months; A books every 6 months. Commercial motor vehicles—tire inspection every 6 months or every 5,000 miles, whichever comes first.

PRICE CONTROL

Refer price inquiries and complaints to the price clerk of your local war price and rationing board.

NOTICE

To veterans of the Civil war, Mexican war and Indian wars and widows remaining unmarried thereof—veterans of the Spanish-American war and World war I, who are disabled to the extent of 40 per cent or more; and widows remaining unmarried of Spanish-American and World war I veterans: Notice is hereby given that all claims for tax exemption must be on file in this office on or before April 1, 1944.
