(AP)—The Munich newspaper Muenchner Neueste Nachrichten, reporting a fantastic black market in cat meat in Budapest, said today that "catnappers" had stolen more than 100,000 household pets in recent months. The black market operators bribe children to deliver cats, sell the meat to butchers and dispose of the hides through fur dealers, the newspaper said.

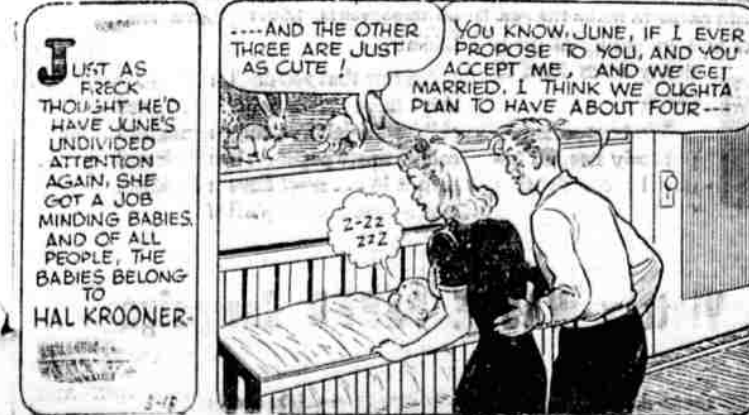
