Farm WAR NEWS

HARNESS SUBSTITUTE MADE

Web harness, far superior to the World War 1 product, has been developed as a wartime substitute for leather harness, according to the WFA. Unlike the 1917-18 product, the new web harness has been treated against water, dry rot, acids and mildew. It also has passed tests on stitching, riveting, stretching and shrinkage, breaking strength, and anti-rat metal tipping. Military demands have sharply curtailed leather supplies.

NEW AUCTIONEER RULES

Auctioneers selling used farm machinery are required to submit to the nearest OPA district office a copy of the list of articles to be sold. The report must be filed at least six days in advance of the sale. The requirement is designed to protect farmers against undue price increases on new and used farm machinery.

Nine classes of used farm equipment are under price control for all types of sales, including auctions. They are: Combines, corn binders, corn pickers, farm tractors, hay balers, hay loaders, manure spreaders, side delivery rakes, and combinations of these items with other items of farm equipment when the combination is sold as a unit. Auction prices on these items may not exceed 85 per cent of the manufacturer's latest list price of less than a year old, and not exceed 70 per cent if more than a year old.

SUGAR FOR CANNING

Farm wives who've been concerned over recent reports of dwindling sugar stocks have been reassured by an OPA announcement that sugar for home canning purposes this year will be rationed at the same rate as 1943. Sugar stamp 40 in war ration book 4 will provide five pounds. In addition, a maximum of 20 pounds per person may be granted on application to local price and rationing boards.

OILMEAL SITUATION EASED

The tight oilmeal situation which has plagued the feed picture throughout the winter appears to be greatly improved at present. The state AAA office has announced that Oregon's allocation from the April set-aside is expected to be sufficient to meet all essential requirements which are not met through normal trade channels.

CCC WOODEN BINS ON SALE

Commodity Credit corporation will do its part toward relieving a tight lumber situation by offering its wooden bins to the highest bidders between April 1 and 17, provided bids equal or exceed established minimums, the county AAA committee has announced. Farmers will be given first consideration, but after April 17 the offer will be thrown open to the public.

Announcement of the available bins, sizes and minimum price will be posted in newspapers, and prospective bidders can obtain complete information at the county AAA office. Sales will be handled by the county committee, who are to dispose of unneeded bins, poorly-located bins, and others considered in excess of local requirements.

The minimum prices have been set on a basis of 10 cents per bushel for unneeded bins, 11c for erected bins, and 12 cents for erected and painted bins. Capa-
