The Prut river and committed to invasion of Rumania, are within eight miles of Iasi, where they will cut one of the railroads by which Germans retreating from Odessa hope to get back to Bucharest.

ON Monday our American Italy-based planes bombed Budapest heavily. The same night the British bombers took over and hammered Budapest in the darkness.

Our planes, you see, are pounding steadily at these vital communication lines. At the same time, they are smashing at German war factories that have been moved into friendly Hungary.

MEANWHILE Russia is taking over the job of trying to split off Hitler's uneasy Balkan satellites.

The Moscow radio calls on the Rumanian people to "abandon the Germans and CAPITULATE at once, warning, "Unless you do, the whole of your country will become a battlefield and your towns and villages a heap of ruins."

WE tried some time ago to split off Germany's satellites and bring them over to our side. Italy responded, GOT INTO VAST TROUBLE, and we were unable to do anything much to protect the Italians from the vengeance of the Germans.

So they have stood pat and done nothing, preferring to risk our DISTANT wrath rather than invite the NEAR AND CERTAIN German wrath.

COUNCIL GETTING ACTION

PROGRESS is reported by City Councilmen Percy Croft and Walter S. Fisher in the matter of connecting Second Avenue South, in Roseburg, to the Pacific highway.

The two councilmen recently went to Portland where they contacted federal agencies, charged with building access roads, and have secured promise of a survey of the Roseburg project.

It is rapidly developing into an industrial thoroughfare, with traffic congestion already critical and scheduled to grow increasingly more serious. One company alone is planning to put a fleet of 50 trucks in operation during the coming summer, which will put 100 vehicles daily over the route, travelling empty one way and loaded when coming west.

There is every indication the street will be built up within the next few months to machinery sales, service and repair agencies and other businesses connected with the mill and timber industries.

There is opportunity, right now, to outline a program which will permit the street to be improved properly at some future date. But if procrastination, red-tape, passing-the-buck, and general neglect are permitted to enter into the picture, the taxpayers are going to suffer when necessity forces an improvement program.

The federal government maintains a fund to aid in construction of roads principally used for access to materials used in the war effort. The project for connecting Second Avenue clearly comes within the scope of the federal-aid program. Access money amounting to more than \$80,000 has been spent in developing a road up Little River to permit of removal of timber from that area.

But, in the event access money is secured to help in building Second Avenue through to the highway, the plan should be made to fit into a scheme for future street widening. The route is a part of the North Umpqua road system, which eventually must be a state highway.

We consider it to be the duty of the state highway department to adopt and furnish, without further delay, a definite plan for eventual improvement. With such data available, it would be possible for the city to impose set-back restrictions on construction of new buildings, permitting essential widening at relatively little expense at some future date.

The city council is to be commended for the work already accomplished. It is to be hoped that it proceeds vigorously to secure action on the part of other agencies.
