Russians Think F. D. R. Certain of Reelection

MOSCOW, April 7—(AP)—Wendell Willkie's withdrawal as a presidential candidate was noted with interest today by Russian newspaper readers but there was no editorial comment reflecting the Kremlin's attitude toward the campaign.

Most people here, however, seem to believe that President Roosevelt is sure of renomination and with Willkie out of the running they figure the campaign is all but over.

Governor Dewey and other possible candidates, except perhaps General MacArthur, are virtually unknown to the Russians.

Potato Support Prices Announced

SAN FRANCISCO, April 5—(AP)—Support prices for western potatoes have been announced by the War Food administration.

WFA will hold its purchases to a minimum, said Regional Director B. F. Maben, and support for late potatoes will be only through commodity loan and diversion programs.
