

New Apple Syrup Offered for Table, Industrial Uses

CLEVELAND, April 4.—(AP)—The U. S. Department of Agriculture today offered the country a new sweet, apple syrup, an amber liquid that is 65 per cent sugar.

The syrup-making starts with ordinary apple juice, and any kind of apple will do. Chemical processes remove all the apple flavors, odors and jelly-making ingredients. Remaining is a syrup which has no flavor except its extreme sweetness.

The syrup was developed in the eastern regional research laboratory, at Philadelphia. It was announced to the American Chemical Society by Doctors F. E. Buck, J. J. Williamson and H. H. Mottern.

The syrup comes in two forms, one for industry, with a slightly bitter after taste which some people like, and the other all-sweet, for table use. The industrial syrup already is on the market. The table syrup is not.

Women soon may be using the apple syrup in their cosmetics, without realizing its presence. Industrially the syrup is a good control for moisture. It has uses in textile making, pharmaceuticals, cork-making and gasket paper.

Under the name of apple honey, about 5,000,000 pounds of the new syrup already has gone into cigarettes. It keeps the smokes moist and substitutes for previous moisteners which have been mostly converted into military uses.

The report said that out of America's annual apple crop of 150,000,000 bushels, about 20,000,000 goes to waste.

general effect of the policy, it said, has been to raise earnings of low wage groups or some of those which lagged behind the general wage upswing.

Nevertheless, total earnings have gone up, the report said, because of longer work hours, higher paying war jobs, and incentives to produce—factors not regulated by wage rate controls. But the basic wage structure has remained substantially unchanged, and wages have been stabilized, the report declared.

Inflation Boogie Upset

It said that the entire stabilization program was in jeopardy a year and a half ago, with the stabilization line breaking sector after sector. When the president read a statement from the report that "prophets of disaster freely predicted an inflationary route," he paused to say he was not naming any names.

The report said decisive action was taken to strengthen the stabilization front and that the measures had succeeded, with the support of the American people.

Families of fighting men, low paid unorganized workers, school teachers, government employees and persons living on old age and retirement pensions, the report said, have found promised protection in the hold-the-line policy. And, Mr. Roosevelt said in an aside, the working press of the United States has been protected from a reduction in wages.
