Farm WAR NEWS

1944 POTATO SUPPORT PRICES
The 1944 support price program as announced by Marvin Jones, war food administrator, includes provision to support potato prices at not less than 90 per cent of parity. Specific schedules by areas and grades will be announced. Prices will be supported through loans to growers, contracts with dealers, and carlot purchases where necessary. The program for potatoes, as for other commodities, will not become effective until approved by congress.

FORAGE CROP SEEDS
Production goals for 1944 call for increased production of hay and pasture crop seeds, reflecting both domestic demands and the needs of allied countries for seed to restore war-devastated farmlands as they are recaptured from the enemy. Increased acreages of alfalfa, red clover, alsike and perennial ryegrass seed are wanted from Oregon farmers. For harvesting these and other legume and perennial grass seeds, a payment of \$3.50 an acre will be made under the 1944 AAA program. Maximum acreage for payment on one farm is 25 acres.

OILSEED MEAL SET ASIDE
Processors of oilseed meal will set aside 20 per cent of their March output as they did in January and February for directed distribution by the war food administration. They will continue to move 80 per cent through their regular trade channels.
