Bender, formerly of Roseburg, now located in Portland that members of the 41st division, Oregon National Guard, have not forgotten General George A. White, their commanding officer, who died in the early days of their war training. "The boys (everyone in the division) just have one regret and that is that General George A. White wasn't here to share this with us," Sergeant Bender writes, referring to the campaign in which the Oregon regiment, which included Roseburg Company D, distinguished itself in action in New Guinea.
