PROCESSED FOODS
BOOK 4—Blue stamps AB-BB. C8-D8-E8 valid indefinitely.

MEAT, BUTTER, FATS AND CHEESE
BOOK 4—Red stamps AB-BB-C8. D8-E8-F8 valid indefinitely.

SUGAR
BOOK 4: Sugar stamp 30 valid for 5 pounds indefinitely. Sugar stamp 31 valid for 5 pounds in definitely beginning April 1.

FOR CANNING ONLY: Sugar stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through Feb. 28, 1945. Apply at local OPA board for more.

SHOES—Loose Stamps invalid. BOOK 1—Stamp 18 expires April 30.

BOOK 3—Airplane stamp No. 1 valid indefinitely. (new stamp to become valid May 1).

GASOLINE COUPONS—Not Valid Unless Endorsed. JUNE 21—Expiration date of No. 11 "A" coupons. (May renew B or C coupons within but not before 15 days from date on)
